# **BEWARE of Fraudulent Websites**

If you happen to come across a website that seems too good to be true, it most likely is. We encourage you to report these suspicious sites to the relevant authorities.

To report fraudulent sites to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), which is the government agency that manages consumer complaints related to identity theft and online scams. You can file a complaint with the <u>United States Federal Trade Commission</u> at <u>https://reportfraud.ftc.gov/#/assistant</u>

Another way to report the website is to use <u>Google's Report Phishing Pages tool</u>. This tool reports phishing pages directly to Google so that they can be removed from search results and blocked from future use. You can access the tool at <u>https://safebrowsing.google.com/safebrowsing/report\_phish/</u>.
